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After almost 35 years, York Region's first Community Hospice is changing our name to better reflect our expanded service area and the wide array of programs and services that we offer.

Hospice King was one of the first Community Hospices in Canada. For almost 35 years we have provided thousands of hours to our clients through our specialized services and support to those diagnosed with life-threatening illness, the people who care for them, and those who are bereaved. In 1999, we expanded into Aurora and changed our name to Hospice King-Aurora. Last year, with the addition of Richmond Hill, we became Hospice King-Aurora-Richmond Hill. We decided a better name was in order and will now be known as Hope House Community Hospice. We are not a Residential Hospice - we offer our many programs and services on-site and our visiting volunteers attend at the client's home. Our 100+ volunteers are trained and supported by professional staff and provided almost 10,000 hours to our community last year. All of our programs are offered free of charge, thanks primarily to the generous support of our community.
